Notes From The Director...


There is a rare kind of story that grows with you. Every time you return to it, you discover a new reflection of yourself—a new question, a new pain, a new joy. *Little Women* is that kind of story. Louisa May Alcott wrote a world filled with fierce love, stubborn hope, and the belief that ordinary lives, especially the lives of women, are worthy of being seen.

Directing this musical has been a reminder of how powerful that message still is. At its heart, this show is about the courage to dream boldly, the resilience to begin again, and the grace to hold on to the people who shape us. Watching them build this vibrant (sometimes messy) family has been one of the greatest joys of this process.

Together, they form a constellation of imperfect, luminous souls—a reminder that every life in a family story matters, and every heart leaves its mark.


