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Notes From The Director...

There are two major factors that are the primary inspiration for what you are about to see. In my decades of working backstage, I've noticed a show that the audience doesn't get to see. It's happening offstage. The cast who are offstage waiting for their cues are occasionally 'shadow performing' what is happening onstage. Sometimes I'll see the entire cast freestyle dancing during the entr'acte of a musical. I have also seen actors who have done the show for



so long that their internal clock is set so they can take naps between cues. (I won't tell you how many times I have partaken in that myself).

Miracle On 34th Street: A Live Radio Play has given me the chance to make that 'extra life' in the wings become a direct part of the show. The cast in this play get moments where they drop the characters they are playing and get to be themselves. Sometimes it doesn't all go according to plan.

My peronal favorite role was the voice of Audrey II in *Little Shop of Horrors*. Focusing only on my vocal performance was very freeing. I didn't have to think about my posture or gestures fitting the character. I could literally do whatever worked to produce the voice of that character. I sounded like the hungry alien plant that was smooth-talking a guy into feeding me people. So by taking a little of the offstage antics and combining it with the freedom of voice-only characters, we created this radio-style production. We've taken a wonderful seasonal story about believing in something when you have no evidence, combined it with a wonderful cast, and added a few items you normally don't get to see. We wrapped it up together to offer a fun night of theatre at ACT. Enjoy!
